From Samuel Webbe's 3rd Selection of Glees, Duetts, Canzonets &c.. Editorial 'corrections': In bar 30 the lack of a third on the 2nd beat can be remedied by changing the 1st note of A2 from D to B: last note of T2, bar 14, changed from D to B: rhythm of S2, bar 18, changed from D. . • to J.

Punctuation and Metronome Marks are editorial.

In solo voice performance the trills in bar 16 could begin on the upper note with a turn as termination. In choral performance, two repetitions without a termination may be preferred. (In the course of the later 18th C. execution of trills was becoming less 'baroque', culminating in Hummel's assertion (1828) that they should begin on the main note.)
